The number of narrow gateway thingies that we had to stop and push the bikes through, particularly on the Kaikohe to Opua day. Slowed progress down considerably. I was going to ride my hybrid bike, but am glad I borrowed an entry level mtb which was great. Tricky on a hybrid I think.

i HATE the very frequent rail guards forcing us to dismount and carefully and slowly wend our way between the damn steel tubes! Sometimes they would be at the bottom of a hill, negating the joy of a downhill. But usually they were just so frequent it made the trail not enjoyable. In addition, there was nothing to see after the train near Kawakawa. We would not cycle this trail again.

Having access to food & drink along the way between Kaikohe & Kawakawa. We were lead to believe we could buy between those points but there was nothing!

the absence of concrete path on the rural part of the trail....gravel would have been more appropriate

get rid of this stupid stops, wickling true, back on the bike, next stop, wickling true..... hope the guy who voted for this stupid things was fired!

The loose metal surface made riding tricky in places. Three cyclists got injured due to the surface. One was seriously injured. I was glad that I had knobbly tyres on my Ebike as they enabled stability.

We felt there were not as many options for food on the trail as the brochures suggest. Wecycled from Kaiwaka to Opua with nothing until Kawakawa. had we known wed have packed a picnic. Second day we cycled Kaiwaka back to Horeke. it was very hot and we ran out of water. We hadnt realised there was drinking water at a toilet block near a campsite. This needs to be better signposted. We thoroughly enjoyed our ride so dont like to complain but feel the food and water facilities need further explanation in the brochures.

Fewer squeeze gates to go through. Constantly disrupted rythm on the bike. Also was a bit too much of the track beside or on the road.
